

Open Call Regulations – Book Of Dreaming: Accessibility Lab

within the project “The Book of Dreaming. Integration of Ukrainian Children with Refugee Experience through Art.”

§1. Organiser

The Open Call is organised by Art Transparent Foundation, based in Wrocław, Poland (hereinafter: “Organiser”). The Open Call is implemented as part of the project: *The Book of Dreaming. Integration of Ukrainian Children with Refugee Experience through Art.*

§2. Purpose Of The Call

The aim of the Open Call is to select participants for the Accessibility Lab programme, which includes:

1. participation in the in-person workshop in Wrocław on 17–19 April 2026,
2. participation in online knowledge and practice exchange sessions,
3. preparation of an expert article (up to 9,000 characters including spaces) in English, to be published in the international repository of knowledge on accessibility and integration.

§3. Eligibility

1. Only natural persons who are at least 18 years of age may participate in the Open Call.
2. Applicants must be nationals or residents of one of the following countries: the Czech Republic, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia, Poland, Slovakia, or Hungary.

3. Preference will be given to individuals with experience in working with refugees requiring adapted support, particularly children and persons with disabilities (practical or lived experience is valued equally to professional employment).
4. Applicants must be available to participate in the in-person workshop in Wrocław and to prepare an article in English.
5. Applicants (from outside Poland and Ukraine) must hold the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC).
6. The Organizer provides travel insurance.

§4. Thematic Scope

The Accessibility Lab programme focuses on:

1. analysing experiences related to accessibility and the integration of refugees with specific needs;
2. practical examples and working methods for engaging with refugees and persons with disabilities;
3. preparing expert content for international publication.

§5. Applications And Timeline

1. Applications must be submitted via the online form provided by the Organizer.
2. The application must include contact details, personal information, information on relevant experience, and a short abstract of the proposed article.
3. The deadline for submitting applications is 10 March 2026.
4. The results of the Open Call will be announced by the end of March 2026.

§6. Selection Process

1. Applications will be evaluated by a committee appointed by the Organizer.
2. The evaluation will take into account the applicant's experience in the field of accessibility and support for refugees with specific needs, as well as the quality of the proposed article.
3. The Organizer may request additional information or a short online interview before making a final decision.
4. The results of the selection process will be published on the Organizer's website and social media channels.

§7. Remuneration And Financial Conditions

1. Five selected participants will receive a fee of EUR 400 gross for preparing a text for the Accessibility Lab programme.
2. The fee will be paid on the basis of a civil law contract concluded between the Organizer and the selected participant.
3. The Organizer will provide accommodation, partial catering during the workshop, and reimbursement of travel costs (train/bus) up to EUR 100, upon submission of an invoice issued to the Organizer.

§8. Participation Requirements

1. The participant undertakes to attend the in-person workshop in Wrocław (17–19 April 2026) and to prepare an expert article in English of no more than 9,000 characters (including spaces).
2. Failure to attend the workshop or to submit the article within the specified deadline may result in the loss of the fee.

§9. Copyright

1. The authors retain the economic copyright to the materials they have prepared.
2. The authors grant the Organiser a non-exclusive licence, without time or territorial limitations, to publish, disseminate, and use the prepared article in connection with the Project and in a publicly accessible repository.

§10. Data Protection

Personal data will be processed in accordance with applicable data protection laws for the purpose of administering this Call and any resulting contract.

§11. Final Provisions

1. The Organizer reserves the right to amend these Regulations in justified circumstances.
2. Submission of an application to the Open Call constitutes acceptance of these Regulations.
